Don't Go Back into Bondage

Galatians 4:8-20

The Apostle Paul had reminded them that because they were adopted as "sons" into the family of God, they were free from the bondage and slavery of the law.

However, in our text, Paul pours out his frustration as he scolds the Galatians for their foolishness because while their status as "sons" granted them freedom, many of them were tempted to go back into bondage of the Law.

The thesis and theme of Paul's admonition to the Galatians and to each of us today is, "since you have been set free, don't go back into bondage!"
